Dear Brother Rawe:

I have at hand your letter of March 10, 1960, in which you relate that the National Director has again taken an appeal to the President in your behalf. This is gratifying and I hope that it produces the desired results.

The fact that you have performed a marriage ceremony and a funeral would not help much; however, the fact that you will be 26 on May 10, 1960, will mean that you will no longer be liable under the present regulations. Of course, if you have had any kind of a deferment such as a 4-F, 3-A or 1-S you are liable until the age of 35 instead of the age of 26. Write to me immediately and tell me about this and also be certain to get in touch with me at once if you receive any word on the action of the National Director's appeal in your behalf to the President.

In event that you do not hear any further word by May 15, 1960, and you are not subject to extended liability then you will have no further dealings with the draft under the present regulations.
