Dear Brother Covington,

On July 7, 1959 I had a hearing befor the hearing officer. Enclosed please flindda#4 page summary.

As you may note near the end of it I examined my file and found several letters concerning my case which were not in my file at any time before when I examined them at the Dreat Board Office. These were not kept in my file nor were they made avaiable to me. They are letters that directly affect my case. For example the minutes of, or the finding of the Appeal Boards which outlined there reasons for not granting me a I-Oper a IV-D. Also letters from the State Directors Office which (if I am not mistaken on this point) were addressed to me or at least had my name on them which directly affected my case outlining in numbered paragraphs their position in my case. My file was in a shambles as to order and so could not take the time to find all the other letters that may be in my file while it is in the hands of the Appead Board but have been witheld from me and not made avaiable to at the Draft Board Office. I have the dates on some of these letters and also a wittness to the fact that they exist and to some of the contents.

Is it illegal for them to withold such information from me? Isn't everything pretaining to my case to be kept in my file? Do you suggest I prusue the matter futher when my file is returned to the local board from the appeal board? If they are not in my file again at this time I could have the local board chairman make a statement written and/or before wittnesses that such documents do not exist or cause him to make these documents avaiable to me.

Do you have copies of the Sicurella, Gonzales, and Simmions cases mentioned in the June 22, 1955 that I could get? Would it be appropriate to quoat or use these cases in so much as their points applied to my case, when presenting my case before the boards?

I am now starting to prepare to answer the final recommendation from the Department of Justice and the Resume of Inquiry when I receive it. When I receive it I shall send a copy of it to you for your suggestions as mentioned in your Dec. 16, 1957 letter. I noticed that in 'New Procedure' under heading of 'Final recommendation...' it says to ask the appeal board for the full F.B.I. report and also request them not to take action in the case untill I have it and an opportunity to comment on it. Nowever this is not mentioned in the later July 1957 'Counsel' under the heading of 'Answering the Recommendation' Is it still proper to follow through with those points mentioned in the April, 1955 'New Procedure.' I noted several documents in my file with dates, Lay 1, 4, 1883. June 11,1883,
